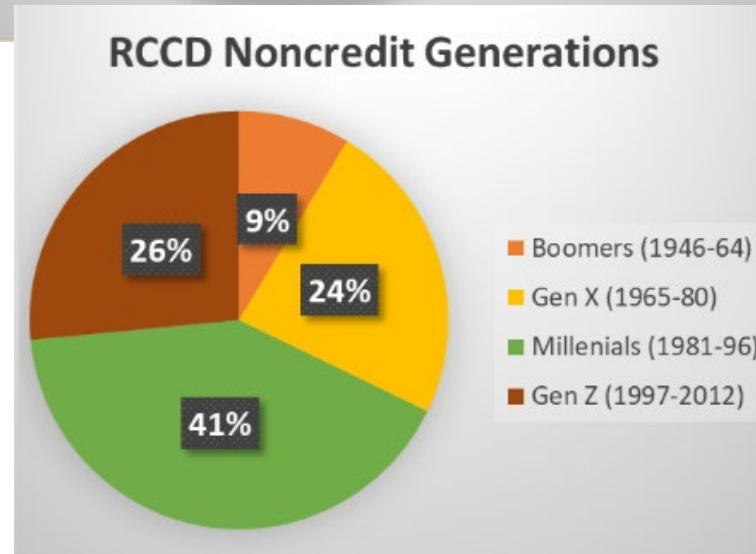
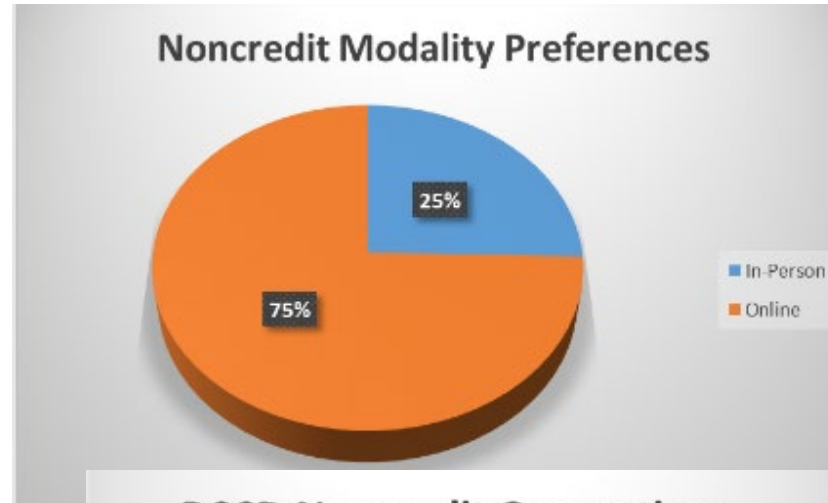
A projected **40% increase** in FTES from last year alone, and an overall increase of **112%** since 2019-20.



More students are COMPLETING noncredit certificates as well, with a 400% increase from FAL21 to FAL22

WHAT WE'VE LEARNED ABOUT OUR STUDENTS.

- They are largely Millennials & Gen Z'ers and are women (born between 1981 and 2012)
