VI. Reports/Updates

a. Moreno Valley College

Dr. Robin Steinback celebrated the support and services to veteran student scholars and announced that the Military Times has ranked Moreno Valley College as one of the best colleges for veterans along with Norco College. This designation has only been awarded to five community colleges in the state. In addition, Moreno Valley College has recently been awarded a veterans Upward Bound grant. The School of Public Safety's personnel has moved into the newly constructed building and provides a well-equipped space to support the region now and in the future. The building dedication will be held Friday, October 7th at 4:30 pm. In response to a pursuit that concluded at MVC, the campus has engaged in an emergency incident management training for operations. Strategic planning meetings, training and retreats are underway at Moreno Valley College to lead on strategic initiatives with a focus on community and communication, and move the strategic plan forward in an inclusive participatory manner.

b. **Norco College**

Dr. Monica Green shared that Norco Colleges is focusing on three areas this year: 1. pathways and enrollment management that follow the student journey; 2. an equity audit focusing on recommendations received last year; 3. analyzing Norco College's budget for efficiency. The campus has engaged in emergency preparedness training with some tabletop meetings coming up. An invitation to the unveiling of Norco College's sculpture *Freedom* on Thursday August 29th at 1 pm was offered.

b. **Riverside City College**

Dr. Rajen Vurdien informed that Riverside City College has placed their focus on celebration with students coming back on campus. Club rush was celebrated for three days guiding students on how to join clubs and help in their community. Engagements for Latinx and Hispanic Heritage month have plenty of events planning at the Riverside City College campus. A 50th anniversary of Title 9 is being planned with a whole week of engagements planned.
