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Recapping the Scaling Guided Pathways Retreat

At the November 2024 Annual Guided Pathways Retreat, RCCD came together to develop strategies, share ideas, and explore new ways to support students more effectively. The day began with a thoughtful reflection on our "why"—the reasons behind the work we do and what inspires us to help students succeed. Breakout groups tackled key topics like student engagement, barriers to success, the role of technology, and how dashboards can guide better decision-making. Throughout the day, live polling allowed participants to share their perspectives, adding valuable insights to the conversation and shaping the direction of our work.

Common themes from poll responses:



In the second half of the day, our office introduced dashboards from our District IR Dashboards App, designed to support strategy development. This app, accessible to all staff, faculty, and administrators, features a variety of dashboards focused on enrollment management metrics and student success. 
David Buitron, Research Analyst
