The meeting of the Riverside Community College District (RCCD) Foundation Board of Directors was called to order by Vice-President Sergio Diaz at 7:35am at RCCD Foundation Alumni House and on Zoom.		<u><b>Call to Order</b></u>

Dr. Star Rivera-Lacey introduced herself as RCCD’s first Deputy Chancellor to the RCCDF Board members. She shared her extensive background in community colleges and expressed excitement about her new role.  Vice-President, Sergio Diaz called the RCCDF Board members’ attention to the previous meeting minutes from November 18, 2025.  <u><b>It was moved and seconded to approve the November 18, 2025 Board of Director's regular meeting minutes: M/S/C: Donna Grant/Thomas Coates.</b></u>		<u><b>Brief Introductions</b></u>   <u><b>Approval of Minutes</b></u>
Chancellor Isaac officially reintroduced Dr. Star Rivera-Lacey as the new Deputy Chancellor and Provost, and shared progress on the district's 5-year strategic plan and partnerships with universities like Cal State San Bernardino and UCR for transfer pathways. The Chancellor also announced the renaming of their study abroad program to "Global Studies" and mentioned upcoming fundraising activities in March to support student participation.  Dr. Eric Bishop, the Interim President of RCC, provided updates on the annual MLK, Jr. brunch, March 23 <sup>rd</sup> Tiger Backer golf tournament, and the goal to reactivate and reform the President’s Advisory Council.  Dr. Monica Green, President of Norco College, shared details regarding spring enrollment, the President’s Circle, and the celebration of its 35th anniversary. The anniversary event will feature the unveiling of the college’s statue on February 24, 2026, at 12:50 pm, followed by an anniversary dinner on March 12, 2026. Also, the college will host an industry partners and awards breakfast, during which Norco’s Alumnus of the Year and two distinguished business partners will be honored.		<u><b>Chancellor’s Remarks</b></u>   <u><b>Presidents’ Remarks</b></u>

**ACTION ITEMS**

**Finance Committee Report**

Chair Mike Fine presented the Financial Highlights Report dated November 30, 2025, revealing that the Foundation's investments and cash holdings totaled \$20.5 million. The total investment portfolio has grown to \$16 million, up from \$10 million in June 2020, and continues to perform very well. He also provided a brief overview of the Foundation's investment policy.

Chair Fine reported that revenue reflects that the year-to-date donations have reached \$556,000, revealing an increase of \$150,000 compared to the previous year. He noted that overall expenses have slightly decreased, with program expenses down by approximately \$150,000, while scholarship expenditures have risen by nearly \$100,000, largely due to staff re-awarding funds from students who did not return

**It was moved and seconded to approve the Finance Committee Report dated November 30, 2025. M/S/C: Mike Fine/Stan Stosel.**

Chair Mike Fine requested the Board's approval of the Finance Committee's investment strategy, which involves consolidating cash by closing the U.S. Bank money market account and reallocating \$111,000 to the investment portfolio. He also proposed transferring \$2 million from the \$3.6 million currently held in the investment money market into the investment portfolio. This \$3.6 million exceeds the annual budget requirement of just over \$1 million and indicated that there is no necessity to maintain the money market and investment money market accounts.

**INFORMATIONAL ITEMS**

**Tribute of Judy Horan**

Dr. Monica Green, the President of Norco College, delivered a heartfelt tribute to Judy Horan, a dedicated advocate for education who passed away on Christmas Eve. In her remarks, Dr. Green emphasized Horan's significant contributions to both Norco College and the RCCD Foundation and acknowledged her lasting impact on the educational community.

ED Jeffrey Kaatz provided the Board with a brief update on fundraising efforts, noting that contributions have increased from \$799,000 to \$924,625 as of December 2025. Recent donations include a significant \$75,000 in which \$25,000 was disbursed to each of the three colleges. Currently, eight out of the seventeen board members have made contributions towards the giving goal of \$1,000.

ED Kaatz also shared that the Nominating Committee is actively reviewing potential candidates for the Foundation's board and aiming to finalize the selections before the March meeting. Currently, the board has three members completing their second term, six finishing their first term, and five potential nominees under consideration. The board has the capacity to accommodate up to 27 members.

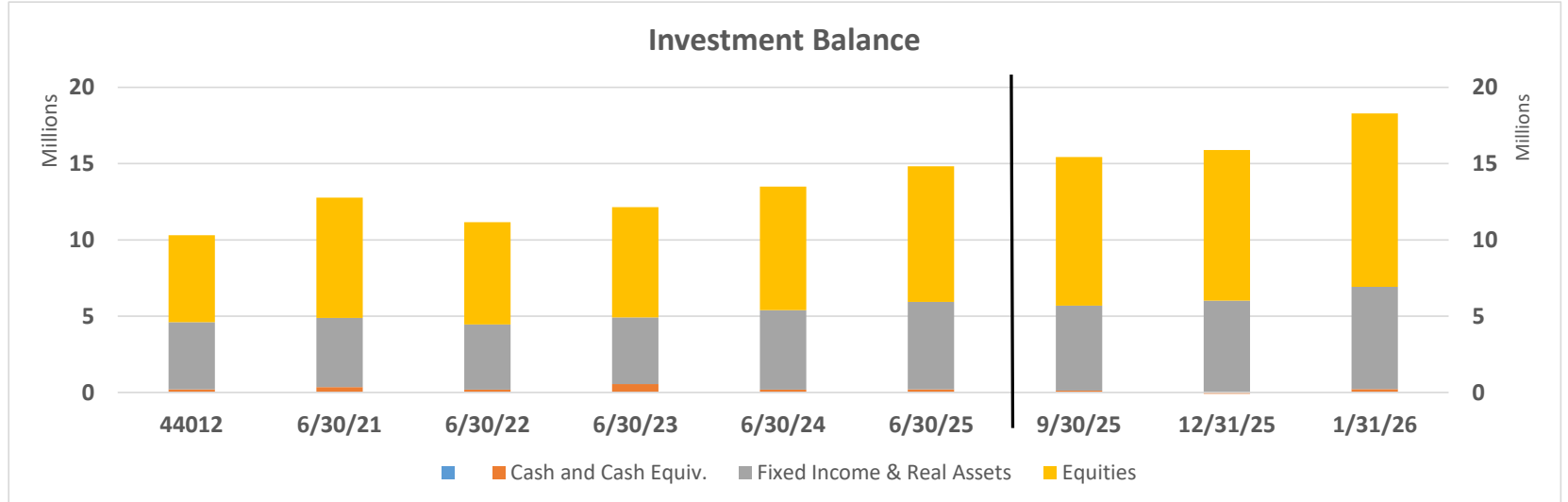

# Board Report: MLK Day of Service 2026

## Overview

Norco College hosted its third annual MLK Day of Service on January 16, 2026. This year's event continued to align with the district's core values of Heritage and Collegiality, emphasizing community engagement, collaboration, and honoring the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. The event brought together students, faculty, and staff to participate in meaningful service activities across Riverside County.

## Participation

- 54 faculty, staff, and students participated on the day of the event
- Participants represented a broad cross-section of the campus community

## Program Highlights

Participants began the day with a keynote presentation from Sabrina Gonzalez, Executive Director of the Civil Rights Institute of Inland Southern California. Her remarks focused on regional civil rights history, influential leaders, and opportunities for Norco College to engage with the Institute's public programming.

Following the keynote, participants engaged in a two-hour service activity at one of five community sites. Lunch was provided, followed by a closing reflection featuring Darrell Jones, a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity—the same fraternity as Dr. King—who spoke about Dr. King's legacy and the importance of service.

# Century Circle Grant Report

## Debunking Girl Math Podcast

February 2026

### Executive Summary

The Debunking Girl Math podcast was born from classroom conversations. Social media is full of financial narratives - some clever, some misleading, and many wrapped in humor that obscures real economic reasoning. This project used that cultural moment as a doorway into economic concepts such as utility, consumer choice, and opportunity cost, inviting students to think critically about the everyday decisions they already make.

Originally designed as a live podcasting series, the project was successfully completed in a recorded format during the winter intersession. Over approximately two and a half weeks, six students contributed significant time and energy to research, discussion, and production, resulting in eight fully recorded episodes. Editing and publication are forthcoming. The work was supported by faculty and campus partners, including Norco College Umoja, the Norco College media, and facilities teams.

The full \$2,000 student stipend was distributed based on participation, and materials and supplies were strategically adapted to meet production needs. The project demonstrated strong student engagement, interdisciplinary collaboration, and clear potential for integration into Zero Textbook Cost and Open Educational Resource instruction. It also surfaced meaningful infrastructure needs for future phases, including live-streaming capability, upgraded equipment, and sustained student-led production.



## **Project Design and Intent**

This project was developed as a student-led, faculty-supported initiative designed to engage students in economics through a format that feels both relevant and accessible. Using the social media phenomenon “Girl Math” as an entry point, the podcast explored consumer behavior, utility, decision-making, and financial reasoning in ways that connect directly to students’ lived experiences. The intent was never to replace the classroom but to extend it, so that economic thinking could happen in a conversational setting while still maintaining academic rigor.

The original design included a live podcasting model with real-time audience engagement, including the potential for questions and dialogue during recording. As implementation began, it became clear that the technical, spatial, and coordination requirements for live streaming required additional equipment and preparation beyond this initial scope. Rather than compromise quality, we shifted to a recorded format. This allowed the team to focus on content, consistency, and student development - and it turned out to be exactly what this first cohort needed.

## **Implementation**

The project was implemented over approximately two and a half weeks during the winter intersession, with consistent use of the Umoja classroom on campus. This was the active phase of the project, whereas, this team and several other students met during Fall 2025 during several planning zoom sessions. The active phase sessions were typically held between 1:30 PM and 4:30 PM across multiple days each week. This dedicated space gave the team room to plan, record, and collaborate in a structured environment that still felt creative and open.

Over this time, eight podcast episodes were recorded, each running approximately 15 to 30 minutes. At this stage, all recordings are complete. Editing and final production are ongoing, with the intention to publish episodes on social media platforms. An Instagram account has already been established, and the team expects these episodes to be available on the institution’s YouTube channel.

These recordings are intended to serve multiple purposes. Beyond broader student engagement through social media, the episodes will be incorporated into Zero Textbook Cost and Open Educational Resource (ZTC/OER) economics courses and used directly in classroom instruction. This extends the value of the project well beyond the initial production phase and embeds it into ongoing teaching and learning.

## **Student Participation and Growth**

Six students participated in the project, rather than the eight originally projected in the grant proposal. Despite this adjustment, the full \$2,000 allocated for student stipends was distributed among the six students in varying amounts based on their level of engagement, time commitment, and contributions to the project. Each student contributed approximately 20 to 30 hours across planning, research, recording, and production. This flexible stipend structure enabled equitable recognition of effort, particularly for students who assumed expanded roles in leadership, coordination, and production.

What stood out most was how students grew into roles that no one formally assigned. Co-hosting, research, scripting, logistics, production support - these responsibilities emerged organically, reflecting a level of initiative and collaboration that exceeded expectations. Students demonstrated the ability to connect economic theory to real-world contexts, engaged in discussions with confidence, and supported one another in this project.

One of the most meaningful outcomes was peer learning. Students shared skills across disciplines, lifted one another through the production process, and developed confidence not just in content delivery but in their own voices. That kind of growth happens when students are trusted with real work and given space to rise.

## **Faculty and Campus Support**

Faculty involvement exceeded initial expectations in the best possible way. While the grant budget supported four hours of faculty effort, the total time dedicated to conceptualization, student recruitment, coordination, scripting, and facilitation for the lead faculty was approximately 51.25 hours. Two faculty members participated in the project under the approved funding structure, and stipend allocations were adjusted accordingly.

Additional technical and media support was provided by campus partners whose contributions were essential to the project's success. Dan Lambros contributed approximately two hours of sound and technical expertise, and Ruth Leal provided between eight and ten hours of media support, including recording setup, lighting guidance, waiver coordination, photography, and production assistance. Their generosity with time and skill made a real difference.

## **Budget and Resource Alignment**

The project remained aligned with the approved budget categories. Materials and supplies expenditures totaled \$895.04, covering microphones, storage devices, cables, a camcorder, headphones, and a soundboard bundle. Additional expenses included \$231 for table coverings to improve the recording environment and \$223.96 for a storage and transport cart and studio lighting. Following these expenditures, approximately \$866 remains, with planned use for chairs and a backdrop or banner to support future recording sessions.

## **Implementation Insights**

Every first iteration teaches you something. The technical demands of audio and video production were greater than initially anticipated, particularly around file management, editing capacity, and equipment quality. No software was originally budgeted, and multiple personal devices were used to support production - a testament to the team's resourcefulness, but also a signal that future phases will need more dedicated tools.

While the initial plan included live podcasting, this phase of the project clarified the specific components needed to support that model: a defined structure of hosts and guest speakers, a reliable streaming platform, an appropriate space for audience engagement, and readiness for real-time Q&A. These elements are not obstacles, they are a roadmap. The fact that we can now name them precisely is itself a valuable outcome of this first phase.

## **Learning Outcomes**

From a learning perspective, this project served as a powerful extension of classroom instruction. Students applied economic concepts such as utility, opportunity cost, elasticity, and consumer choice in a dynamic and conversational format. They examined how economic narratives are presented on social media and how those narratives shape consumer behavior. The podcast structure encouraged critical thinking, thoughtful discussion, and the ability to communicate economic ideas clearly.

An equally important outcome was the identification of student strengths that might otherwise go unrecognized. Students demonstrated analytical reasoning, creativity, technical skill, and leadership.

Several took the initiative in production, logistics, and content development, while others emerged as strong facilitators of discussion. These are the kinds of strengths that applied, collaborative learning environments are uniquely positioned to surface.

## **Looking Forward**

This project established a strong foundation for future work. There is a clear opportunity to expand into live podcasting with audience engagement, develop a structured series with rotating hosts and guest speakers, and build this into a sustained student-led platform at Norco College. With additional infrastructure and planning, the Debunking Girl Math podcast, under the planned student GDP (economics) club (at Norco College) could grow into a bigger initiative centered around student voice, economic literacy, and the kind of learning that stays with people long after the semester ends.

Overall, this project met its core objectives while also revealing new opportunities for growth. It confirmed something I have always believed to be true in this work: students engage deeply when learning is relevant, interactive, and connected to real-world experiences. And when structured yet flexible collaboration is built into the design, the outcomes extend well beyond what any single assignment or exam could capture.
