Background Narrative:

Pursuant to California Assembly Bill 481 (2021), codified at Government Code Sections 7070-7075, public agencies are required to provide annual reports to their governing bodies regarding the acquisition, inventory, use, and oversight of defined "military equipment." This report fulfills the statutory requirement set forth in aforementioned government code sections.

During fiscal year 2024-2025, RCCD Police Department (RCCD PD) maintained a limited inventory of items classified as military equipment under AB 481. This inventory consisted of patrol rifles, less lethal shotguns, and less lethal launchers. The less lethal launchers were acquired during the current reporting period, while all other items represent previously owned equipment.

This equipment is maintained exclusively for purposes of emergency preparedness, the protection of District's students and employees, and officers. The acquisition, possession, and use of such equipment are governed by the RCCD PD Procedure Manual, Procedure 705 - Military Equipment. Deployment is strictly controlled and limited to the circumstances expressly authorized under this procedure.

This equipment enables RCCD PD to respond effectively to active, high risk, and life threatening incidents, as well as situations where less lethal force options may be necessary to reduce the risk of serious injury or loss of life. Deployment is restricted to personnel who have successfully completed California POST certified training and meet ongoing qualification requirements, ensuring responsible, proportional and lawful use in accordance with established standards.

During the reporting period, no AB 481 designated military equipment was deployed. Therefore, there were no associated complaints, procedure violations, injuries, or required corrective actions pursuant to Government Code Section 7072(b)(2)-(5).
